On behalf of Mayor Ashok Sridharan, who is attending the farewell visit of Federal President Gauck today, I would like to extend a warm welcome to the participants of this fifth Plenary session of the Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services.

Let me say that Bonn is very proud to host IPBES, which forms an important part of what has become a true powerhouse of sustainability!

This powerhouse features 19 UN organizations shaping a sustainable future from here. Key players in the fields of government, development cooperation, business and academia, media and NGOs are actively supporting these endeavors. And the City of Bonn itself has become an active partner in many initiatives and processes.

The important work that IPBES is doing contributes towards the credibility of decision-makers around the globe. It provides

Bonn is clearly fertile ground for global development and a great platform for debates and cooperation in the field of sustainability. I would even go so far as to call the city itself an interface. In our international city on the Rhine, global agendas are brought together at all levels.

The Bonn Science Network BION, for instance, is currently running a regional biodiversity assessment and preparing a symposium on the occasion of the International Biodiversity Day. BION unites more than 40 institutes and organizations that are active in interdisciplinary biodiversity research.

Our Mayor is also the First Vice President of ICLEI Local Governments for Sustainability and Bonn has been engaging with their Biodiversity Programme since 2007.

2017 will offer huge opportunities for sustainability and for Bonn! Our city will be welcoming the 23rd meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Climate Change Convention. COP 23 will be a fine occasion to bring together some major agendas here. Since the finalization of the Paris Agreement and the 2030 Agenda, the world is increasingly reflecting on the interfaces between topics and organizations. Bonn seems to be the perfect place to catalyze this beneficial process towards sustainability.

Ladies and Gentlemen, I know that this 5th session of the IPBES Plenary will be a forum filled with the fruitful exchange of knowledge and will lead to even further scientific excellence! May it be a true interface between topics, structures, disciplines and policy-making!

And may it help us to streamline our efforts towards a sustainable future for our planet!
