In the context of environmental governance paradigm, the role of "state" is changed (towards facilitation of stakeholders' dialogue instead of command/regulative role) but still unavoidable. The "state" is simply irreplaceable and that's why the answer on the question "whose capacities", should certainly include "state", particularly in the less developed parts of the world.
